I am writing to tell you about an exciting project proposed by some of our Members which you may like to support and take part in.

With the development of digital camcorders and computer editing systems it is now possible for amateurs to produce films to DVD and TV quality. Your Committee has therefore been asked to support a project to produce a film of Thomas Hardy's *The Woodlanders* during the summer.

In order for the Committee to determine whether such a production is feasible and to gauge the support of the Members I should be grateful if you could complete the attached form and return it to Sarah Finnegan or by email to Jim S

The Woodlanders has been chosen because it is set in and around Sherborne, is of local interest and would allow the use of authentic location for many of the scenes. Copyright lasts for 70 years from the date of the author's death. As Thomas Hardy died in 1928, there are no longer any copyright restrictions on *The Woodlanders*, allowing us to use the result in any way that your Committee decides.

The Players very successfully performed *The Woodlanders* about 20 years ago in the Digby Hall. The stage adaptation from the book was made by local author and APS member Lance Salway who is prepared to help with this production too.

Responsible for the production would be a Director, who would direct the scenes and actors and be responsible for the artistic side of the production, and a Producer, who would be responsible for the organisation. Jim Schofield, who originally proposed the project and whom you will know from his excellent set design and construction of our recent productions, will be the Producer. The choice of Director will depend on the interest expressed by you, our Members.

It is intended to undertake screen tests and auditions shortly, and the main filming during July and August. If you express an interest and return the attached form you will be contacted in good time. Modern digital filming techniques will mean that, unlike a stage production, scenes can be shot by small teams working and experimenting together.
