

On Monday 17 June, The Guardian published an article on its theatre blog celebrating the country's 9.4 million participants in amateur theatre, highlighting the increasingly blurred boundaries between amateur and professional theatre.

The article, by The Guardian's theatre blogger, Lyn Gardner, points out that the incredible talent seen in the last RSC Open Stages shows that professionals can learn as much from amateurs as the other way round.

She concludes her blog with this pithy reminder: "When professional prejudices surface and people sneer and say "am-dram", perhaps we should remember the old joke: professionals built the Titanic but amateurs built the Ark."






