As you know, the Autumn Production during the week beginning Saturday 27th November (Move in to Digby Hall) will be "The Heiress", a dramatisation of Henry James's celebrated novel, and will be directed by Vivian Vale who writes:

Set in the downtown residential quarter of New York in the year 1859 - a great opportunity to create 'period' and 'atmosphere' - the play explores the plight of a young and diffident heiress, daughter of a brilliant but cold and dryly ironic father who regards her as commonplace. Wooed by a worthless suitor, Morris Townsend, a ne'er-do-well whose experience in worldly matters is in strong contrast to her own innocence, Catherine's conflict of loyalties is exasperated by a sentimental and rather preposterous

aunt, whose well-meant interventions propel the plot to a crisis and a chilling consequence. The characters are:
