PROGRESS REPORT ON CHAPEL PLANS Everything in planning tales longer than anticipated and finally I have received what looks like a favourable view on the plans for Change of Use of the Chapel to performance-space/theatre. I have instructed the architect, Tom Maunder, to draw up plans for the main building, obtain quotations and apply for building regulation approval. I doubt if I will hear any more before the New Year.

The idea is to rebuild the upstairs floor approximately halfway from the front porch, leaving the 'altar' end of the chapel at full height. Stage lighting can be installed upstairs. The roof will be well insulated and, of course, electrics totally renewed. It seems to me that building work should start as soon as all scenery etc. has been removed for the Great Expectations performance in April. The costumes must be rehoused at this time.

Work on the Vestry part of the building to accommodate toilets and Green Room space will be complicated and I envisage planning and work on that should wait for completion of the main hall. Malcolm


'Mrs Beeton, My Sister'
